· Inaugural 'Willcox on the Move' Q&A

• This month, the city hosted its inaugural 'Willcox on the Move' session, a monthly Q&A and public discussion event with city leaders. The meeting was led by City Manager Caleb Blaschke, Mayor Mike Laws, Vice Mayor Greg Hancock, and Councilmember Carl Hestand, and took place at Dos Cabezas Coffee Co. Several community members participated, engaging directly with officials on key issues. The main topic for this session was the city's parks, with a particular focus on the construction progress of the new city pool. Looking ahead, next month's discussion will address city streets and is scheduled to be held at the KOA's Roadrunner Café on Tuesday, July 23rd.

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Pool Timeline

- 10/2019 City Council evaluates pool including operating expenses, revenue, capital costs. At the time pool companies
 estimated the cost to repair the liner, deck, chlorine and heating system to be \$520,000. This did not include replacing pipes
 or possible cracks in the pool foundation once the liner was removed. The City planned to use CDBG funds to pay for the
 improvements.
- 1/20 COVID Pandemic Begins
- 01/21 City staff began applying for AZ State Parks and Trails with Susan Pater
 3/21 City staff meet with Mickey Rogers, Grant Director \$1,312,600 sought for pool
- 03/21 Began working with imperial Pools for reconstruction of existing pool after contacting over 30 pool companies in AZ, Texas and California.
- 6/21—City Council officially applies for AZ State Parks and Trails funding and began rolling savings from pool operations into a reserve account.
- 1/2022 City is officially awarded funds by Arizona State Parks and Trails
- 3/2022 City awards bld to Aqua Design for Pool Design \$99,750
- g/2022 City goes out to bid for pool construction and does not receive any bids.
- 1/2023 City goes out to bid under a Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) Contract Rock House Construction, Shasta, Cirmmagen
- 04/2023 Based on evaluations Cimmaron was selected
- 04-06/2023 Staff began negotiating with Cimmaron on price and value engineering.
- o7/2023 Contract approved by Willcox City Council
- · 10/2023 Pool Construction begins
